- 1. How would you define faith? Skim the different people mentioned in Hebrews 11. What is it that made these people examples of strong faith?
- 2. What is the source of faith? How do you get faith? How can a person grow in their faith?
- 3. Read James 2:14. Why would someone "claim" to have faith who does not really have it? Why is "faith without deeds" unable to save?
- 4. Read 2:15-16. Why does James give this illustration to describe someone with dead faith? What is the connection between helping the poor and genuine faith?
- 5. Read 2:19. What is the difference between saving faith and "demonic" faith?
- 6. Read Mark 2:1-5. Why was the man healed because of his friend's faith? How does the faith (or lack of faith) of a community or group affect the individuals in the community?

Application Questions:

- 1. What is the worst danger of dead faith?
- 2. Was there ever a time in your life where you would have described your faith as "dead"? What changed?
- 3. What are some signs that a person has a living, growing faith?
- 4. What is the difference between strong faith, weak faith, and dead faith?
- 5. What are some practical ways that we can care for the physical needs of other believers?
